## About Tom Chapin

Tom Chapin is a Grammy Award-winning musician, entertainer, singer-songwriter and storyteller. Adult albums and kids' albums, contemporary folk and pop, Tom Chapin's music spans styles and generations. For more than thirty years and through twenty compact discs, Chapin has entertained, amused and enlightened audiences of all ages with life-affirming original songs told in a sophisticated array of musical styles.

Mr. Chapin has gained widespread critical and popular acclaim for his recordings aimed at 4 to 11 year-olds and their families. Tom and his collaborators John Forster, Michael Mark and Jon Cobert have created a body of songs which are quickly becoming children's classics. His family albums have been recognized with awards from the American Library Association, Parents' Choice, the New York Music Awards, the National Association of Parenting Publications and Parents Magazine. Five of his family recordings have received Grammy nominations for Best Musical Album For Children, including *Some Assembly Required*, Tom's newest family recording. Billboard magazine calls Chapin "the best family artist around."

Tom is also a beloved narrator of children's books on tape. Three of his narrations won Grammy Awards for Best Spoken Word Album for Children: *Mama Don't Allow* in 2001, *There Was An Old Lady Who Swallowed A Fly* in 2002, and *The Train They Call The City Of New Orleans* in 2004.

Proceeds from the concert will support the Council's work promoting accessible, high quality early care and education in Westchester County.
