# Byron Smalls City of White Plains Youth Bureau

Byron Smalls, Educational Coordinator, at the White Plains Youth Bureau, is a lifelong resident of Westchester whose family has been here for many generations, and has a great love for his community. He attended college at Norfolk State and SUNY Purchase, graduating Magna Cum Laude with a Bachelor's degree in Sociology from Purchase. He earned a Master's Degree in Public Administration from the Metropolitan College of New York, graduating Magna Cum Laude.

There, Byron has directed programs and projects too numerous to list, including the Bits n Pieces Summer Tutorial Camp, the Saturday Academy program, and the After School Program where he has served as a teacher, program director, coordinator and Department Head. He served as the Scout Reach coordinator for the City of White Plains Youth Bureau, introducing over a hundred boys to the world of scouting. He helped create and direct the Youth Bureau's 21st Century-funded elementary and middle school program Club Excel, and has helped secure millions of dollars in grant monies to help support programs for the city of White Plains.

For many years, Byron has been an active participant and leader in the Child Care Council's School Age Director's Network, where he served as Vice President and President for many years. Byron was the longest serving member on the Board of Directors of the Child Care Council of Westchester, and was the recipient of the prestigious Joey Award, honoring people for distinguished contributions to the field of child care in Westchester. Byron was selected several years ago by the National After School Alliance to serve as one of eighteen Afterschool Ambassadors in the United States.

Byron is an active member of the Ridgeview Congregational Church, The Gedney Farms Neighborhood Association, and the National Association of Black School Educators. As a member of the Beta Alpha Alpha Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., he has served on numerous committees, including as chairman of the Scholarship Committee. In 2006 he received the Basileus Award from Omega Psi Phi for outstanding work and ongoing commitment to the youth and families in Westchester.



# Deloris Hogan Dee's Tots Child Care

Deloris (Hayes) Hogan, Co-Owner of Dee's Tots Child Care, was born in Mississippi, one of six children, and moved to NY in 1970. Just four years later, while living in New Rochelle, she set eyes on her future husband for life, Patrick, for the first time. The couple first wed in 1985, then renewed their vows in 1995. They have four children: Jacquetta (mother of Jadeleana, aka Jelli), Randy (father to Chayse), Jacarra (who works in the family business), and Izaiah.

Deloris' career in child care began while the family was living in a basement apartment, when a friend asked her to help her out with her child for a few days while she recuperated after an accident. In 1992, they bought a house on Lincoln Avenue, and have been providing care seven days a week in the "decorated house on the hill on Lincoln" ever since. Throughout their 37 years in business, the Hogan's have had hundreds of families walk through their doors. They continue to thank each one of them for entrusting them, and all home-based providers, with their most precious gift: their children. Deloris, known as Nunu to the children and families she serves, understands the awesome responsibility she has assumed when a parent agrees to enroll their child in Dee's Tots. "Once that happens, their child now becomes my child," she said. "And your family becomes my family. We nurture and teach. We keep them safe. And we love them!"

About five years ago, Deloris was approached by Loira Limbal, Director/Producer for Firelightmedia to do a documentary on the 24-hour daycare world. The documentary, Through the Night, was selected to "World Premiere" at the 2020 Tribeca Film Festival. Many awards followed from film festivals across the country (2021-Best Social Impact Film - Greenwich International Film Festival, 2020-Human Rights Awards from the Hampton's Documentary Festival, 2020 DOC NYC Special Jury Recognition for Ethic of Care Award, and many others). The documentary was also nominated for the 2020 NAACP Image Award- Outstanding Breakthrough Creative (Motion Picture) and was a New York Times Critics Pick. In 2021, Deloris and Patrick became Early Learning PBS Champions. May 10, 2021, the documentary was viewed nationwide on PBS/OPV Television Broadcast Premiere. Through the Night has also been shown in Canada, Puerto Rico, Brazil, Colombia, England, Ireland and Norway.

"I would like to give a special thanks to our team: Jacarra Hogan, Joscelyn James, Sharon Mercer, Margaret Spencer, Victoria Wilbon, and Caron Kerr. Patrick started working for the New Rochelle Community Action Agency and landed a position with Barclays Bank in 1974. ### Howard Milbert Ossining Children's Center

Executive Director of the Ossining Children's Center (OCC) since 1985, Howard Milbert heads a large not-for-profit child care center, one of the oldest day care centers in the country (founded in 1895). He is known throughout New York State as a leading voice for high-quality child care and early childhood education.

At OCC, Howard oversees educational child care for infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and elementary school-age children. The current enrollment is 160 children. Thanks to Howard's leadership, the Ossining Children's Center has earned an outstanding reputation for its childcentered philosophy, its individualized approach to teaching and child care, and its signature enrichment programs. At the same time, he has maintained the Center's commitment to tuition assistance for low- and moderate-income working families, despite the caprices of the economy and government funding. Howard oversaw the Center's expansion into infant and toddler care in 1996 (which included the creation of a program for teen mothers), the establishment of OCC's Pre-K partnership with the Ossining Public Schools, and the building of OCC's new state-of-the-art school, which opened in November of 2020.

The aforementioned program for teen mothers provides child care, parent coaching, and mental health support for teen parents, enabling them to finish high school; the program is a collaboration with Ossining High School and Westchester Jewish Community Services. Many of OCC's former teen mothers have gone on to college and some have gone on to graduate school. In another partnership with the Ossining Public Schools, OCC provides three sections of the School District's Full-Day Universal Pre-K, with the added convenience of before- and after-school care to meet the needs of working parents.

In 2017, the OCC Board determined – after a feasibility study – that the Center needed a new physical plant. In partnership with the Board and senior staff, Howard began work on a Capital Campaign to raise the funds to design and build a new child care and education center. After having raised more than \$19 million, OCC opened its new award-winning building in November of 2020.

Howard's devotion to the children and families entrusted to OCC's care is matched by his commitment to advocating for high-quality, affordable child care for all. He is co-president of the Westchester Early Childhood Directors Association, a former co-chair of the New York State Association of Directors of Not-for-Profit Child Day Care Centers, and a former Board member of the New York State Early Care and Learning Council. He has testified many times at New York State legislative and administrative hearings on child care and/or early childhood education.

Since coming to OCC in 1985, every year Howard has organized OCC families to attend and show support for child care at Westchester County's annual budget hearings. In addition, during times when child care was on the chopping block, he worked closely with the Child Care Council and Westchester Children's Association to organize rallies; he engaged local clergy in advocacy, and he facilitated letter-writing and call-in campaigns. During last fall and winter's push for major increases in County and State child care funding, he spent hours on the phone calling OCC board members and day care directors throughout Westchester to encourage them to call their legislators.

Before coming to OCC in 1985, Howard was a teacher at United Cerebral Palsy of New York City. He earned an Advanced Certificate in Administration and Supervision from City College of New York, an M.S. in Special Education from Hunter College, and a B.A. in History from New York University.





### Kathy Lynam Rye YMCA (ELC Program)

Kathy Lynam has been a highly-respected member of the Rye YMCA's staff since 2003. In her current role as Senior Program Director for Family, Camp and Child Care, she oversees all aspects of the Rye Y's child care programs, including licensing, hiring, budgeting, supervision of senior staff, grant-writing and day to day operations.

The Y's child care programs include:

•The Early Learning Center (full-day licensed child care for ages 18 months-5 years). •After School Adventures (licensed after school care at two locations for grades K-6) •Pre-School Enrichment Program (half-day, morning or afternoon for ages 3-5) •Summer Camp (full day and extended camp at two locations for ages 3-14 throughout the summer).

In total, these programs employ approximately 240 full and part-time staff members and serve approximately 550 toddlers, children and teens.

Kathy has been instrumental in the recent expansion of the Y's child care programs, including the Early Learning Center (launched in October 2021) and the opening of the After School Adventures program at F.E. Bellows Elementary School. For the Early Learning Center (ELC), she oversaw curriculum development, hiring, purchasing, and the renovation of much of the Rye Y's first floor to create additional classroom space. When the newly renovated classrooms were destroyed by Hurricane Ida's flooding just days before the September 7 opening day, Kathy rolled up her sleeves and oversaw the second renovation of our first floor. Today, the bright and cheerful classrooms are filled to near capacity with young children who are thriving in this new program.

Kathy is always seeking new ways to bring critically-needed child care to the Sound Shore area. When the 2020 summer camp was canceled due to the pandemic, she oversaw the opening of a full-day, seven-week summer child care program. In September 2020, the Rye Y expanded its licensed school age child care program to provide full-day, half-day and after school care—including help with remote learning—for over 100 children from eight school districts as their families dealt with ever-changing school schedules. And, under Kathy's leadership, the Y is currently in talks with a Mamaroneck community organization to bring a Rye Y nursery school program to their site.

Kathy lives with her husband and six-year-old daughter in the Bronx. In her spare time, she enjoys spending time with her family, listening and dancing to music as well as volunteering within her community.
